AWARDS Received in 2012:

- First in Participatory Planning category of National Planning Award
- 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the All-Island Cooperation Ireland Pride of Place awards for our Community Garden
- 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 2<sup>nd</sup> overall with Meath An Taisce Ellison Awards
- Nominated to represent Ireland in the international LIVCOM Awards in 2013!

Tidy Towns Sub-Group achievements in 2012:

- **Spring:** massive **"Clean Up" project at the Old Mill site** with over 20 local residents helping on 3 separate weekends. An huge amount of rubbish was removed from the site and our thanks once more go to all involved, especially Panda Waste, Indaver Ireland, Meath County Council and The Glenside Hotel for their generous sponsorship and support. In
- *May* our **first Mad Hatter's Tea Party** in the community garden, we also officially unveiled our beautiful gardent art **sculpture by Roy Breslin**. We also hosted our fund raiser Coffee Morning, to help with our application to Meath partnership **to buy the tents, table and chairs** etc that we now use at all our outdoor events.
- Summer: Increased our Tidy Towns marks by 5 points! We started several new village enhancement projects planting on the hill, placing a bench at the woods and added a new wildlife pond to the Community garden., and held the Street Fest morning.
- Autumn: Meath County Council nominated us to represent County Meath in the Community Garden category of the All Island Co Operation Ireland Pride of Place competition and in August we organised a major village presentation in the garden for the judging panel. We were also selected for nomination for the "Ellison Award" of Meath by An Taisce
- *Halloween* saw us run an extremely well attended **"Spooky Night" bonfire party** in the Community Garden. There were plenty of treats, mystic moments and a great atmosphere, the weather was also very kind to us.
- Winter: The year closed with a fantastic Christmas in the garden, where Santa managed to drop by to see us, and caught a lift on a local tractor, accompanied by his elves! Mulled wine and mince pies rounded off a very busy year here in Julianstown!

#### Heritage Sub-group work 2012:

Following substantial historic research, The Heritage Sub-group completed and published their booklet on Julianstown called **Heritage Footprints.** It was funded by Meath Partnership and launched by Gavin Duffy in May and distributed widely.



#### Tourism Sub-Group work in 2012:

In 2012 the Tourism Sub-group was formed and successfully applied for applied for and received LEADER funding from Meath Partnership to engage a tourism consultant do **a Tourism Feasibility Study on Julianstown**, in line with the goals of our VDS. In May we held a public consultation meeting and had several follow-up meetings with Meath County Council and the owners of the Old Mill.

We are delighted that the report has just been completed and recommends the development of a Nanny Greenway and the restoration and

development of the Old Mill site. The report will be

presented to the community On February 15<sup>th</sup>

next in the Parish Rooms at 7.30

## The Bridge and Streetscape Sub-group work in 2012:

Several planning meetings were held with Meath County Council and Meath Partnership early in the year to progress the concept of making a feature of our historic bridge with antique lighting and also to develop a streetscape plan to make the main street more attractive and slow down traffic. This work was put on hold pending a bat survey and the outcome of the Tourism Feasibility Study.

### Administration and Finance Sub-group:

Huge work was achieved through fundraising and grant applications to raise significant money for all our work in 2012. Big thank you to our TUS workers, all our members and sponsors and especially to Meath Partnership, Meath County Council and The Heritage Council for their ongoing support.
